




Remaining Rubbish, Bio-Waste, Recycleable Materials - What Goes Where?

Black Dustbin



- sweepings
- vacuum cleaner bags
- nappies
- cigarette ends, coal ash
- sanitary towels, tampons
- cotton buds, cotton wool
- wallpaper remains
- carpet remains
- broken china and porcelain (small amounts)
- leather
- rubber
- light bulbs
- scraps of cloth
- medicines
- wax candles remains
- laddered nylons
- sticking plaster, dressing material
- disposable syringes
- old ink pads
- empty ballpoint pen refills
- broken window panes
- razor blades
- bicycle tyres
- dried out paints and varnishes
- tooth brushes
- disposable lighters
- photos, negatives, slides (small amounts)
- plastic coathangers
- plastic toys
- plastic pipes
- plastic laundry baskets
- plastic spring folders
- files
- (cat) litter

Bio-Dustbin (brown)



Kitchen Waste for example:

- fruit and vegetable remains
- coffee grounds and tea leaves including coffee filters and tea bags
- eggshells
- absorbent paper for example coffee filters, paper towels made of cellulose,
 - e. g. paper hankies, serviettes, kitchen roll, dirty newspapers
- egg cartons and other paper maché packaging
- small pieces of crumpled paper
- leftover cooked food
- rotten or mouldy leftovers such as bread, meat, sausage and cheese
- spoiled dairy products (not milk!)
- bones
- droppings vom small pets, such as rabbits, guineapigs or birds
- hair, feathers
- wood shavings (only nontreated wood)
- wood ash

Garden Waste for example:

- hedge cuttings
- shrub cuttings
- grass cuttings
- leaves
- other vegetable garden waste

Light-weight Packaging for example

■ plastic containers

e. g. shampoo bottles washing-up liquid bottles pots of dairy products polystryrene tray packaging from fruit, vegetables, meat

plastic foil

■ composite materials

e. g.
milk cartons
juice cartons
soup packets
vacuum packed coffee
packaging
confectionery packaging

aluminium

e. g. tubes yoghurt pot lids chocolate foil

Collecting Container



Recycleable Bottles and Jars green glass brown glass white glass

Wastepaper, Cardboard newspapers, magazines catalogues, brochures writing paper, coloured paper circulars envelopes flour and sugar bags corrugated cardboard boxes grey and white boxes washing powder boxes

frozen food boxes Tins/Cans

please put the tins/cans into the the collecting container and only use the yellow bag if no container is available) cans tins aerosol cans bottle tops



Further Possibilities for Recycleable Materials:
